Mozart Requiem



Mozart's final composition remained unfinished at his death. The *Requiem* was commissioned anonymously in mysterious circumstances (you might have seen this in the movie *Amadeus*). Mozart's student, Süssmayr, completed a version that has been around for a couple of centuries.

However, we will be singing a version prepared in 1996 by Robert Levin.

"Levin's changes have added balance, symmetry, & cohesion" says Noel Edison, who conducts the concert. The changes (vocal & instrumental) add real substance to the music. There is a whole new *Amen* chorus not heard before!

To add to the excitement, some of Robert Desrosiers' dancers will be performing while we sing the Requiem.

Desrosiers is one of Canada's most innovative choreographers & dancers.

His company performs original works that integrate modern dance, theatre, & other media. With their distinctive choreography they promote the enjoyment of dance internationally, while enhancing understanding of Canadian people & culture. Raminsh A Shining Peace

The Choir commissioned Imant Raminsh to compose a new work to open this concert. A Shining Peace draws text from the Bible and World War I poetry, showing how even in times of great strife, peace awaits us finally. Possibly the first 21st century music you will hear, it is in a gentle harmonic idiom that effectively illuminates the meaning of the words.

Raminsh is a Latvian-Canadian composer recognized internationally for his outstanding choral work. His distinctive textures, lush harmonies, & lyrical melodic sense have attracted numerous commissions. Doreen Rao wrote of his music: "Like Bach, there is always a dance. Like Brahms, there is always harmonic beauty."

The Toronto Mendelssohn Choir is now in its hundred & somethingth season. More at www.tmchoir.org.

If you are new to choral music - there are 4 sections in the Choir, sopranos (women, high voices), contraltos (women, low voices, also called altos), tenors (men, high voices), & basses (men, low voices). Sometimes they all sing the same words together, as in a hymn. Sometimes they sing the same or similar words but at different times, so that several words sound together. It's surprising how effective this can be!

Anyone can join the Mendelssohn Choir, incidentally – that is, anyone who can pass the audition. But be warned: the singers have to re-audition every year. No one enjoys this, but it keeps standards high.
